TO: Captain S. J. Foxrrese, Offenbach Archival Depot,

1. The Library of Congress Mission requests that the confiscable portion of the collection of books and other library materials belonging to the INSTITUT DER NSDAP ZUR ERFORSCHUNG DER JUDENFRAGE, be turned over to the Mission for evacuation to the United States for deposit in appropriate American libraries.

2. The INSTITUT DER NSDAP ZUR ERFORSCHUNG DER JUDENFRAGE was a component part of the NSDAP and its property is considered confiscable.

3. The Library of Congress Mission is empowered by the War Department and by theater concurrence to evacuate confiscated materials deemed surplus to the theater's needs.


