

Proclamation

WHEREAS, the Holocaust was the state-sponsored systematic persecution and annihilation of European Jewry by Nazi Germany and its collaborators between 1933 and 1945; and

WHEREAS, six million Jews, the primary victims, were murdered and millions more were also targeted for destruction because of their ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, impairment, or politics; and

WHEREAS, the history of the Holocaust offers an opportunity to reflect on the moral responsibilities of individuals, societies, and governments; and

WHEREAS, mankind should always remember the terrible events of the Holocaust and remain vigilant against hatred, persecution, and tyranny; and

WHEREAS, the Days of Remembrance have been set aside to remember the victims of the Holocaust, as well as to reflect on the need for respect of all peoples; and


WHEREAS, pursuant to an Act of Congress, the United States Holocaust Memorial Council has designated the Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust as April 15 through April 22, 2012, including the Day of Remembrance known as Yom Hashoah on April 19, 2012;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Commission of the City of Coconut Creek, Florida, hereby proclaims April 15 through April 22, 2012, as


"DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE"


