3. What information is only found in article #2? What other information on the same page may have competed for reader attention?
4. [If consulted] What information is only found in article #3? What other information on the same page may have competed for reader attention?
5. Are the articles all found on the same page? How prominent is each story?
6. Does any information in the articles not agree with information in the other article(s)? If the articles differ in some respects, why do you think that may be the case?
7. What did you learn about the Holocaust from these newspapers that you did not know before?
