what they do

Dear friends—this past November, 40-foot-high portraits of Estelle Laughlin and other Museum survivor volunteers were projected one by one onto the exterior of our building. The symbolism was stunning as each illuminated the night. Estelle had just turned ten when Germany invaded Poland. Over the next four years, she managed to survive the Warsaw ghetto, the Majdanek death camp, and two slave labor camps. With dreams still haunted by these memories, Estelle shares her story with audiences here and across the country in order to, as she says, "keep truth alive and visible."

In telling their stories, Holocaust survivors put the horror of the genocide of Europe's Jews into a profoundly personal context. They move us beyond the monolithic event and unfathomable numbers to the anguish of each individual, and then to the sobering realization that millions more were complicit—whether through their actions or sheer indifference. That is the truth of the Holocaust: it was not inevitable, nor is the history being written today. What we each do matters. Every time these survivors speak, they powerfully demonstrate the responsibility each individual must assume in creating a more just and humane world. And it begins with the actions we take each day.

Thanks to your extraordinary personal commitment, especially during these challenging economic times, the Museum engaged millions of people worldwide last year with this truth. No other institution is bringing the lessons of the Holocaust to so many people in so many languages and so many places. But

Piotr is ensuring that Auschwitz remains relevant to new generations

Preserving Auschwitz is not only preserving the past, it is preserving the future. With this trust placed in us, each day we must ask ourselves what more can we do."

The trust factor put 36-year-old Dr. Piotr Cywiński on a journey nine years ago that he could not have imagined when survivors invited him to become the youngest member on the International Auschwitz Council. It was, as Piotr says, "putting me in the center of a 20th-century history that I had wanted to escape." Today, some two years after becoming the director of the Auschwitz-Birkenau State Museum, Piotr is still overwhelmed that survivors trusted him with the most critical experience in their life.

The defining symbol of the Holocaust in a rapidly changing Europe, Auschwitz is even more important today than it was 20 or 30 years ago. A 2008 Pew Research survey reports that growing numbers in several major European nations say they have unfavorable opinions of Jews. More alarming is that these percentages are higher than in comparable Pew surveys taken every year since 2004. As European demographics change, will future generations see Auschwitz as part of their history and identity? Preserving Auschwitz and other sites as well as documentary evidence of history's greatest crime is of utmost urgency-material evidence is critical to securing memory and is

the most powerful way to counter Holocaust denial. But what we do with this evidence will determine the continuing relevance of the Holocaust for future generations. "This is the challenge that keeps me awake at night," says Piotr. "Memory is the first step, but alone it cannot guarantee the future."

While the Museum works with many institutions worldwide, our partnership with Auschwitz-Birkenau is unique. Our Permanent Exhibition would not be possible without the artifacts on loan from Auschwitz, and we provide conservation guidance that helps this site preserve its massive collections. Today, our colleagues at Auschwitz are looking to us for our expertise in creating exhibitions that engage diverse audiences in transformative experiencesespecially young people increasingly distanced from this history. Under Piotr's leadership, annual visitation to Auschwitz now exceeds one million, with people coming from all over Europe and as far away as China. "Now we are at a very special moment," says Piotr. "This place must speak more to the imagination of the new generations so that they understand the significance of this event and their responsibility for the future of their societies, of humanity."

Eli is pursuing perpetrators and justice with the Museum's help

When one tries to imagine the terror of the mother and the little girl facing a pit filled with thousands of bodies. then one tries hard not to imagine."

The 1941 murder of six-year-old Fruma Kaplan and her mother, Gita, at the killing pits outside of Vilna (Vilnius) is the case that touches Eli Rosenbaum like no other. No prewar photos or documents about them have ever been found. "But for the records we found and used in court, their story, like that of so many other victims, would not be known," says Eli. What we do know is that they escaped from the Vilna ghetto and hid in the countryside before being sent to their deaths by former Lithuanian police chief Alexandras Lileikis. Eli and the Office of Special Investigations (OSI) team first got the lead in 1982 that Lileikis was living in Massachusetts. It took a decade before investigators had enough evidence to prosecute, including the death warrants for Fruma and her mother that Lileikis had signed. Stripped of his U.S. citizenship, he stood trial in Lithuania.

For Eli, the amount of time it takes to bring perpetrators to justice is immaterial. "The passage of time has in no way lessened the gravity of the offenses or the culpability of those who committed them," he stresses. "Our partnership with the Museum is enormously important to efforts to prove these cases beyond a reasonable doubt." The Museum grants OSI

priority access to its archive-the world's most comprehensive collection of Holocaust evidence—and Museum historians provide expert witness testimony in prosecutions. In December, OSI reciprocated, donating copies of its records to the Museum's archive. Created over decades of investigating and prosecuting alleged perpetrators of Nazi crimes who immigrated to the United States, the records represent the largest body of English-language, primary source material relating to the prosecution of Nazi criminals and include documents from more than one hundred successful prosecutions, such as the Lileikis case. "The Museum is the premier destination for Holocaust scholars and researchers in the world," he explains. "Each piece of paper and testimony is part of an overall effort to pursue, at a minimum, full historical truth . . . and in our work, also law enforcement, truth, and justice."

The passion that has driven Eli's every waking moment for 25 years parallels the Museum's own commitment with its world-class team of professionals relentlessly searching for truth in more than 40 countries on six continents. This expensive, methodical, and timeconsuming work to collect evidence makes everything else possible.

RESCUING THE EVIDENCE AND MAKING TRUTH ACCESSIBLE The Museum's years-long leadership in opening the largest closed Holocaust archive in the world—the International Tracing Service (ITS) in Bad Arolsen, Germany-finally paid off in 2008. After the transfer so far of 133.4 million digital copies of ITS documents and name cards, the Museum has responded to thousands of requests for information, enabling Holocaust survivors and their families for the first time to observe death anniversaries for their loved ones. SHAPING THE RELEVANCE OF HOLOCAUST STUDIES IN THE CONTEXT OF TODAY'S ISSUES Supporting new research on an international level, last year the Museum hosted 40 visiting fellows from institutions as diverse as Harvard University and Greensboro College and countries such as Poland, Hungary, and Ukraine. Some 150 more scholars participated in workshops, seminars, and symposia. And as part of our campus outreach program, the Museum hosted 78 programs with scholars and fellows at 69 colleges and universities in 31 states, from Oregon to Maine, including many institutions with limited Holocaust resources. EMPOWERING PEOPLE WORLDWIDE TO CONFRONT HATE, ANTISEMITISM, AND INJUSTICE Requests for the Museum's ethical leadership programs tripled in the past year. Federal employees from 36 different agencies participated, including the CIA and the Departments of Defense, Education, Homeland Security, and Labor. At the request of the Arizona Supreme Court, the Museum developed a new leadership training program, LAW AND THE HOLOCAUST, and trained all 700 Arizona state judges—from magistrates to the state supreme court. Doug is arming FBI agents with core values in a post-9/11 world

It's not enough to protect society. The Museum's ethical leadership program demonstrates for our agents how important it is to protect everyone in that society with compassion, fairness, and a rigorous obedience to the Constitution."

Doug Merel knows that if the first time a law enforcement agent thinks about ethical issues is when they are occurring, it is too late. Doug had been serving as a field agent for 17 years before coming to the FBI Academy six years ago to teach ethical leadership to new agent trainees. One of the first things he did was accompany a group of agents participating in the Museum's Law Enforcement and Society program. "It was then," says Doug, "that I began to understand the tremendous implications of the Holocaust for law enforcement. The most important part of this program is that it drives home for the agents that core values always have to be part of their decision making."

Through a progression of discussions built around photographs dating from 1933 to 1942, culminating in a shocking photograph of a uniformed German police officer shooting women and children rather than protecting them, the program chronicles the breakdown of a society when its law enforcement professionals become devoid of compassion and fairness. "Through this focused discussion, our agents realize the significance of their role in a fair and balanced democracy."

Doug immediately made this training a required component of his ethical leadership class. Three years later, after he arranged for the FBI Director to personally experience the power of the program, it became a mandated part of the FBI training curriculum. Because of Doug's single-handed effort, every new agent is trained at the Museum—each year some 1,000. But he did not stop there. Driven by his own personal commitment, Doug has extended the reach of the program beyond the FBI. Today personnel from Immigration and Customs Enforcement and the Drug Enforcement Agency train at the Museum. Through a new partnership brokered with Doug, the heads of the largest law enforcement agencies from around the world now participate in this training. If Doug had his way, each of the 800,000 individuals in law enforcement making decisions daily that impact the society we live in would be trained by the Museum. "When you are exposed to something of such tremendous benefit to your profession, you cannot keep it to yourself."

This is just one of a series of unique programs the Museum provides around the country for audiences who influence society—teachers, law enforcement officials, military officers, doctors, lawyers, judges, and journalists—a critical mass of professionals uniquely positioned to promote understanding of the Holocaust—and act on it.

Jennifer is working to build tomorrow's engaged citizenry

I want to help students understand that there are things they can do as citizens of their school, their community, their nation-as citizens of the world. They can educate themselves and become more active in standing up against hatred."

A child was slapped in the face. Two more were hit or struck on their arms. They were attacked by fellow students—all for being Jewish. According to their classmates, it was "Hit a Jew Day." And while this was taking place, others stood by and watched. This event did not occur in 1930s Germany but took place in 2008 at a middle school in Missouri.

The universe of students Jennifer Norton is reaching extends far beyond the walls of her school in Jackson, California. And whether training other teachers or teaching her own students, Jennifer believes that understanding the Holocaust starts with understanding antisemitism. "Especially in communities like mine," explains Jennifer, "where students have no background with Jews, Judaism, or antisemitism, I start from scratch." Her goals are to impart the lessons that hate is hate and that individual actions matter. "I want them to understand that the perpetrators, the collaborators, and the bystanders were ordinary people and that a different outcome was possible had people acted differently." As part of the Museum's Regional Education Corps—a team dedicated to extending the reach of the Museum—Jennifer is at the heart of our effort to carry the power of this truth into classrooms across America, many in underserved areas. "There is an almost unlimited hunger for the resources that only the Museum can bring to these communities," says Jennifer. And she understands why.

Growing up in a small community, Jennifer always had an interest in the Holocaust but never had access to any classes in Holocaust history. It was only as a teacher, when the Holocaust became part of California's required

curriculum, that she delved deeper into the subject while creating lessons for her world history classes. Five years later, Jennifer was accepted into the Museum's Teacher Fellowship Program. "Virtually everything that has happened since in my teaching career flows from that experience." And what has happened through the efforts of this one remarkable teacher over the past ten years is considerable. How do you measure the radiant impact of her initiating efforts to have the Holocaust integrated into the national Advanced Placement history curriculum? Or as a consultant with the College Board, developing a lesson on the history of antisemitism for teachers of European history? And in New Mexico, where there is no explicit teaching of the Holocaust in the state education framework, her workshops inspired two teachers to secure permission to establish Holocaust classes in their own schools.

Jennifer is excited about the new opportunities of extending the Museum's reach through technology. And particularly the Museum Web site, ushmm.org, "is truly a global classroom today," she says. Any class with a computer anywhere in the world can engage with this history. As the global leader in Holocaust education, the Museum demonstrates there is nothing like the power of this history to help people rethink their roles in society. Whether our audience is young people or adults, each person comes to realize that education alone is insufficient. What matters is what you do with it.

WHAT EMPOWERING PEOPLE WORLDWIDE TO CONFRONT HATE, ANTISEMITISM, AND INJUSTICE On the ground and online, our outreach continues to expand dramatically. Our team of advanced Holocaust educators nearly doubled the number of teacher-training workshops conducted nationally, especially in underserved communities. We forged a new partnership with the National Education Association—representing three THIS million teachers nationwide—to generate interest in teaching the Holocaust and its lessons to its membership. Building on the increase in online visits from Middle Eastern countries following translation of Web content into YEAR Arabic and Farsi, the Museum added Russian and Urdu to available languages at ushmm.org—the world's most comprehensive online Holocaust resource. John is helping the U.S. government improve its ability to prevent genocide

While working with refugees who had fled Bosnia, it struck me that if people could be so effective in systematically destroying lives, then people could be just as effective in preventing it."

John Heffernan knows what genocide looks like. He knows the terrible cost of indifference. Over a span of 20 years as a humanitarian aid worker and human rights investigator, he ran field operations in Sudan and lived in Khartoum and the former Yugoslavia. He has also worked with refugees who had fled Bosnia as well as with other victims of genocide. "While admittedly there are hard days, knowing that there are people out there who can't speak for themselves inspires me to do what I do." But John is also driven by the conviction that more must be done. "I still believe that preventing genocide is possible."

By the time he became director of the Museum's Genocide Prevention Initiative three years ago, John knew there was no stronger platform than the Holocaust from which to act on this conviction. And no more uniquely positioned organization than the Museum to address one of humanity's most vital issues. "After I had conducted three investigations in the Darfur region of Sudan, I felt strongly that there were clear signs of genocide in 2004, but none of the major human rights organizations would call it genocide. It was the Museum that said it first, issuing an alert and igniting the movement to confront it." While the Museum continues to lead efforts to

build the critical mass needed to save lives in Darfur, John observes, "We don't only want to be in the business of responding to genocide. We also want to be in the business of preventing it."

Utilizing its unique stature and building on its extensive relationships, the Museum convened a partnership in 2007 with the American Academy of Diplomacy and the United States Institute of Peace to create the first high-level commission dedicated to move genocide and mass atrocities from the margins of the foreign policy debate. "The purpose of the Genocide Prevention Task Force and its recently released report is to provide concrete recommendations to the new administration about what it can do to prevent genocide and how to introduce systemic change into our government to make this possible."

The co-chairs, former Secretary of State Madeleine K. Albright and former Secretary of Defense William S. Cohen, and 11 other members of the Task Force powerfully make the case that genocide and mass atrocities threaten core American values and national interests and outline how the U.S. government can prevent these crimes in the future. **JOHN HEFFERNAN DIRECTOR OF THE MUSEUM'S GENOC**

CREATING A BLUEPRINT TO PREVENT GENOCIDE AND MASS ATROCITIES On the eve of the 60th anniversary of the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide in December 2008, the Genocide Prevention Task Force released its final report calling for high-level attention, standing institutional mechanisms in Congress and the Executive Branch, and strong international partnerships. The report goes on to provide 34 specific recommendations for responding to emerging threats of genocide and mass atrocities, including early warning mechanisms, early action to prevent crises, timely diplomatic responses, and action to strengthen global norms and institutions. Clemantine is joining with the Museum to speak out against injustice

When we went to all these countries being treated like we were garbage, we were less than humans, it didn't matter that we were mixed ... Hutu and Tutsi and Twa It just mattered that we were all trying to survive."

Clemantine Wamariya was only six when genocide erupted in her native Rwanda. She cannot recall the specifics of when and why, but she can remember the terror and the noises and the hunger. She remembers her parents sending her and her then 16-year-old sister, Claire, to what they hoped would be the safety of their grandparents' farm. She remembers the drive there, the stench of the corpses rotting in the road. And she remembers the night her grandmother screamed for her and Claire to run—and then watching from trees as family members were slaughtered. And then she remembers walking. "You don't know where you're going but you just keep going. You don't rest, you keep going." Left alone to fend for themselves, the two sisters crisscrossed several African countries, spending years in the squalor and disease of refugee camps. But they did survive.

Brought to the United States in 2000 to live with a family in Chicago—what she calls her "miracle"—Clemantine

picked up the remnants of her life and again "just kept going," unaware that a book she would read in school would irrevocably change her future. The words of Elie Wiesel's Night empowered this child of genocide to confront her painful memories and helped her understand that in telling her own story she might help create a better world. "Having that responsibility scares me a little bit—but it's a good scary," she says.

Since 2006, Clemantine has taken her place at the side of Holocaust survivors to challenge the world to do more more to stop the genocide in Darfur and more to educate new generations on the responsibility each individual has to do the right thing. "The Holocaust happened, and we are so ashamed that no one did anything," she says. "And then we are talking about Bosnia. We are talking about Rwanda. And now another one? We need to teach our kids that you're not better than that person; you are just the same." Clemantine now has the power to teach that lesson. Her testimony is part of the Museum's installation From Memory to Action: Meeting the Challenge of Genocide—one of our innovative initiatives to increase awareness that the power to create a more just and humane world has humble beginnings in the actions we take each day. What we each do—or choose not to do-matters.

TRAVELING EXHIBITIONS Twenty-four communities in 17 states hosted the Museum's traveling exhibitions in 2008, including smaller locations such as Frankenmuth, Michigan; Brunswick, Maine; and Hot Springs, Arkansas.
